NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill or Bills, for the several purposes after-mentioned, or some of them,—viz. To alter, amend, and in part repeal, an Act passed in the 48th year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, entitled "An Act for the farther supply of the City and Suburbs of Glasgow and places adjacent with Water," and an Act passed in the 52d year of the Reign of His said Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Cranstonhill Water Works, to raise more money for the farther supply of the City and Suburbs of Glasgow, and places adjacent, with Water," and an Act passed in the 50th year of the Reign of His said Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Cranstonhill Water Works, to improve their Works;" to alter and amend, and enlarge the powers of an Act passed in the 46th year of the Reign of His said Majesty, entitled "An Act for supplying the City and Suburbs of Glasgow with Water," and another Act passed in the 9th year of the Reign of His said Majesty, entitled "An Act for altering and enlarging the powers of an Act passed in the 46th year of the Reign of His present Majesty, entitled "An Act for supplying the City and Suburbs of Glasgow with Water;" to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Cranstonhill Water Works to sell and dispose of the Works and Property belonging to them, to the Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works, and to enable the said Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works to purchase and acquire the same; to empower the said Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works to raise a farther sum of money; and to alter, and increase or diminish, the rates and duties granted by the said recited Acts, or any of them, or to repeal, partially or wholly, the said rates and duties, and to enable the said Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works to levy other rates and duties in lieu thereof;—the Works by the said several recited Acts authorised to be made and maintained, and the places thereby authorised to be supplied with Water, being situate in the City, Burghs, or Towns, and Parishes after-mentioned,—viz. The City, Town, and Burgh of Glasgow. The Towns or Burghs of Gorbals, Anderston, Calton, and Bridgeton. The Barony Parish of Glasgow, including the Parishes of Shettleston, Saint Stephen's, Anderston, Saint Mark's, Hope Street, Milton, Calton or Middle Calton, Saint Luke's or West Calton, Bridgeton, and Cambachie; the Parish of Glasgow, including the Parishes of Saint George's, Saint George's in the Fields, Saint Peter's, Brownfield, Saint Enoch's, Saint David's or Ramshorn, Saint Mary's or Tron, Blackfairs or College, Saint John's, Saint Andrew's, Saint James', Inner High Church, Outer High Church or Saint Paul's, Saint Thomas', Albion Street, Saint Ann's, Saint Columba's, Duke Street, Bridgegate, and Chalmers', and the Parishes of Gorbals, Kirkfield of Gorbals, Govan and Rutherglen, and New or West Church Parish Rutherglen, all in the Counties of Lanark and Renfrew, or one of them.
