BY THE KING, A PROCLAMATION. FOR A GENERAL FAST.

GEORGE R.

WE, taking into our most serious consideration the just and necessary war in which we are engaged, for the maintenance of the independence of our Crown, for the desence and protection of the Commerce, and of the Rights and Liberties, civil and religious, of our subjects, and putting our trust in Almighty God, that he will graciously bles our arms, both by sea and land, have resolved, and do, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, hereby command, that a Public Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that part of our kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the 8th day of March next; that so both we and our people may humble ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain pardon of our sins; and may, in the most devout and solemn manner, send up our prayers and supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy judgments which our manifold sins and provocations have most justly deserved; and imploring his blessing and affistance on our arms, and for restoring and perpetuating peace, safety, and prosperity, to us and our kingdoms: and we do strictly charge and command, that the said Public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all our loving subjects in Scotland, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his wrath and indignation; and upon pain of such punishment as we may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the performance of so religious and negessary a duty. Our will is therefore WE, taking into our most serious consideration the just and dignation; and upon pain of fuch punishment as we may justly instict on all such as contemn and neglect the performance of so religious and necessary a duty. Our will is, therefore, and we charge, that this our proclamation seen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other places needful, and there, in our name and authority, make publication hereof, that none pretend ignorance: And our will and pleasure is, that our Solicitor do cause printed copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewards of Stewartries, and Bailiss of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom we ordain to see the same published: And we appoint them to send copies hereof to the several parish churches within their bounds, that upon the Lord's day immediately preceding the day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the pulpits immediately after divine service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, his Majefty hath received information, that the plague has broken out in the idland of Corfica, in confequence of communication with a veffel from Barbary, and that many veffels had left Corfica on the alarm, and even fome from the very port where the infected veffel came in, and where the infection raged; and that fome of these veffels are probably bound through the Straits of Gibraltar: his Majesty this day took the same into consideration, and although it appeared, that a quarantine of forty days is at this time subsisting, by orders of this Board, upon all ships coming from or through the Mediterranean, except those coming directly from any of the ports of the kingdom of Spain within the Mediterranean, or from the island of Minorca, laden with the products of Spain only, and also except ships and vessels arriving from the town or port of Gibraltar, provided the cargo on board all such ships or vessels do consist entirely of non-enumerated articles, (except any bags, straw, matting and platting on jars, which were solely made use of as package for such non-enumerated articles) yet his Majesty, with the advice of his Privy Council, judges it necessary upon this occasion to cause his orders for the performance of quarantine to be ensorced and extended: And to that end his Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby order, require and command, that the substituting quarantine be trivitly ensorced, and that all the officers appointed for the fervice of WHEREAS, his Majesty hath received information, that the his Majetty, with the advice aloreiaid, doth hereby order, require and command, that the fublishing quarantine be firstly enforced, and that all the officers appointed for the fervice of quarantine do use their utmost care and diligence in causing the several rules and regulations established for the due perthe feveral rules and regulations established for the due performance of quarantine to be punctually and strictly observed and carried into execution.
