

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT it is intended to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for making and maintaining a road from, at or near Cartland Craigs Bridge, in the Parish of Lanark, to the Turnpike Road at or near Hazlebank, in the Parish of Lesmahagow, and building a Bridge across the River Clyde, at or near Hazlebank, in the line of said Road, and to enter upon and take and use the lands, houses, gardens, and other property necessary for such purposes; and so far as necessary for the above purposes, to vary, alter, amend, and enlarge the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the first year of the reign of his late Majesty, King George IV, entitled, 'An Act for making and maintaining certain Roads and Bridges in the Counties of Lanark and Dumbarton,' and of another Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of his late Majesty, King George IV, entitled 'An Act to alter, amend, and continue an Act passed in the first year of the reign of his present Majesty, entitled, 'An Act for making and maintaining certain Roads and Bridges in the Counties of Lanark and Dumbarton,' and of another Act passed in the fourth and fifth years of the reign of his late Majesty, King William IV, entitled, 'An Act for making, and for more effectually maintaining and repairing certain Roads in the County of Lanark, and for building a Bridge over the River Clyde at Crossford, in the said County,' and to adopt and apply the provisions of an Act passed in the first and second year of the reign of his late Majesty King William IV, entitled 'An Act for amending and making more effectual the Laws concerning Turnpike Roads in Scotland.' And in which Bill it is intended to take powers to levy rates, tolls and duties, on the said proposed new line of Road; and also to levy pontage-duties at the said Bridge to be erected across the River Clyde, at or near Hazlebank. Which Road and Bridge intended to be made, built, and maintained, are situated or intended to be made in the Parishes of Lanark and Lesmahagow, in the County of Lanark.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN,

That the Duplicate Plans and Sections of the said new line of Road and Bridge intended to be made, together with the Books of Reference thereto, containing the names of the owners, lessees and occupiers of the lands, houses and heritages in or through which such works are to be made, or which are to be taken for such purposes, required by the standing orders of Parliament, will be deposited for public inspection on or before the 30th day of November next, in the Offices of the Principal Sheriff-clerk of the County of Lanark, at Lanark; and with the Schoolmasters of the several Parishes of Lanark and Lesmahagow, respectively; or if there be no Schoolmaster for either of said Parishes, then with the Session-clerk of such Parish, at his residence, on or before the 31st day of December next.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT application is intended to be made to Parliament, in next Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to enlarge the term, and continue, alter, explain, and amend the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled, 'An Act to make and maintain a Canal in the County of Lanark, from the Monkland Canal to the Lands of Dunchattan, on the north side of Duke Street of Glasgow,' and to enable the Dunchattan and Monkland Canal Company, incorporated by the said recited Act, to make and maintain an extension or branch of the said Canal, navigable by Boats and Barges, with Basins, Wharfs, Towing-paths, Locks, Lifts, Bridges, Machinery for passing Heights and Acclivities, Feeders, Wasters, and Roads of communication, and other necessary works and conveniences, from a point upon the Lands of Meadowpark or the Lands of Whitehill, to, and to communicate with the River

Clyde, at a point to the eastward of Rutherglen Bridge; which Canal and proposed extension or branch thereof, and Works connected therewith, are, or will be situate in, and pass from, through, or into, or near to the Royal Burgh, and Royalty or extended Royalty of Glasgow, the Burgh of Calton, Saint John's Parish of Glasgow, and that portion of the said Parish of Saint John's separated therefrom, *quoad sacra*, under the denomination of the Parish of Saint Thomas, and the Barony Parish of Glasgow, and those portions of the said Barony Parish, separated, *quoad sacra*, therefrom, under the denominations of the Parishes of Calton, Camlachie and Bridgeton; And it is intended to take power, and to make provision in the said Bill, for supplying the foresaid intended Canal, and Basins and other Works connected therewith, with Water from the said Monkland Canal, and from the Forth and Clyde Canal, which two last mentioned Canals are joined together, and communicate with each other by a Cut or Canal, called the Cut of Junction, passing from Port Dundas to the Monkland Canal, and which Forth and Clyde Canal, and Monkland Canal, and Cut of Junction, are, or will be supplied with Water from the following Reservoirs, *viz.* Hill-end Reservoir, in the Parishes of New Monkland and Shotts, Blackloch in the Parishes of New Monkland and Slamannan, the Lillyloch and Shotts Farm Reservoir in the Parish of Shotts, the Water from which Reservoirs, is, or will be transmitted through the said Monkland Canal; and the said Forth and Clyde Canal is supplied with Water from the following Reservoirs, from which the Water is transmitted directly into the same, *viz.* Bishoploch or Gartloch in the Parishes of Cadder, Old Monkland, and Barony Parish of Glasgow, Woodend Loch in the Parish of Old Monkland, Lochend Loch in the Parish of Old Monkland, Johnston Loch in the Parish of Cadder, Garnqueen Loch in the Parish of Cadder, Townhead Reservoir in the Parish of Kilsyth, and Shirva Dam in the Parish of Kirkintilloch; And it is also intended to take power in the said Bill to construct and maintain a Reservoir on the Lands of Shotts Burn, Fortissat and Shotts Farm, in the Parish of Shotts, and to convey the Water therefrom by a Conduit or Feeder to the Stream called the Shotts Burn, from which it will flow by the said Stream, and by the River Calder into the Monkland Canal, with Sluices, Bridges, Wasters, Roads of communication, and other necessary Works and conveniences connected with the said intended Reservoir and Feeders; which intended Reservoir and Feeders, and Works connected therewith, will be situate in the Parish of Shotts; And notice is also given, that a Plan and Section of the said intended Canal, with a Book of Reference to the said Plan, will, on or before the 30th day of November next, be deposited for public inspection in the Office at Glasgow of the Sheriff Clerk of Lanarkshire, and that Copies of the said Plan, Section, and Book of Reference, will, on or before the 31st day of December next, be deposited for public inspection, with the Town Clerk of the Royal Burgh of Glasgow, and with the Parochial Schoolmaster, or where there is no Parochial Schoolmaster, with the Session Clerk, of each of the said Parishes respectively, as also that Plans and Sections of the said intended Reservoir and Works connected therewith, and Books of Reference to such Plans, will, on or before the 30th day of November next, be deposited for public inspection in the Offices at Glasgow and Hamilton respectively, of the Sheriff Clerk of Lanarkshire, and that Copies of the said Plans, Sections and Books of Reference, will, on or before the 31st day of December next, be deposited with the Parochial Schoolmaster, or if there should be no Schoolmaster, with the Session Clerk of the Parish of Shotts; And it is intended by the said Bill to take power to levy Rates, Tolls and Duties, for the use of the said intended Canal and other Works, and for the Passengers, Goods and Commodities carried thereon, and to alter the Rates, Tolls and Duties granted by the before recited Act; And it is intended by the said Bill, to alter, explain, and amend, as far as may be necessary for the before-mentioned purposes, an Act passed in the eighth year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, 'An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable Cut or Canal from the Frith or River of Forth, at or near the mouth of the River of Carron, in the County of Stirling, to the Frith or River of Clyde, at or near a place called Dalmuir Burnfoot, in the County of Dumbarton, and also a collateral Cut from the same, to the City of Glasgow, and for making a Navigable Cut or Canal of communication from the Port or Harbour of Borrowstonness, to join the said Canal at or near the place where it will fall into the Frith of Forth,' and an Act passed in the sixth and seventh year of the reign of his late Majesty William the Fourth, entitled, 'An Act for improving, enlarging, and extending the Forth and Clyde Navigation, and certain Harbours and Works belonging thereto, and connected therewith; and for making and maintaining two Branch Cuts or Canals from the said Navigation,' and certain other Acts recited in the said last mentioned Act, which were passed in the eleventh, thirteenth, twenty-fourth, twenty-seventh, thirtieth, thirty-ninth, forty-sixth, and fifty-fourth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Third, and an Act passed in the first year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, enlarging, explaining, altering, and amending the said Acts, or relating to the said Forth and Clyde Navigation.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that it is intended, in the ensuing Session of Parliament, to apply for leave to bring in a Bill for abolishing, altering or modifying and regulating the Rates, Duties, and Customs, commonly termed the MARKET and PETTY CUSTOMS, at present exigible by and payable to the LORD PROVOST, MAGISTRATES, and COUNCIL of EDINBURGH; such Rates and Duties or Customs, so to be abolished, altered, or modified, comprehending amongst others those denominated the Meal and Corn Market Customs; the Fruit and Green Market Customs; the Weighage and Lyage Dues, and Market Customs on Leather; the Poultry and Bread Market Customs; the Fish Market Customs; the Imposts on Wine and Foreign Spirits, Ale, and Beer; the Land Flesh Market Customs; the Customs on Bestial payable at the House of Muir and Flecks; or by whatever other name or names such Rates and Duties or Customs may be denominated;—and for authorising and enabling the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the said City, to levy and raise other and more uniform Rates, Duties, and Customs in lieu thereof; and for regulating the House of Muir Market, Hallow Fair, and the whole other Fairs and Markets of the said City, and the Rates and Duties payable thereat, and for levying other Rates and Duties in respect of the same; for levying Dues or Rents for Stalls and Stands in the different Markets and Market-places within the said City; and for altering, enlarging, and improving the same, or altering the Sites of the said Markets and Market-places, or any of them; for letting the said Rates and Duties or Customs, or any of them, and for other purposes connected therewith; for altering and amending the Act of the third year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intitled 'An Act for regulating the mode of accounting for the Common Good and Revenues of the Royal Burghs of Scotland;' and for substituting the Rates, Duties, and Customs so to be altered, modified, and regulated, as a security to the Creditors of the said City, in lieu and place of the existing Rates, Duties, and Customs, over which a security is granted to them by an Act of the 1st and 2d years of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intitled 'An Act to regulate and secure the Debt due by the City of Edinburgh to the Public, to confirm an Agreement between the said City and its Creditors, and to effect a Settlement of the Affairs of the said City and the Town of Leith;' and for altering and amending all or any other Act or Acts, Statute or Statutes, Laws or Customs, in so far as may be necessary for effectuating all or any of the purposes aforesaid: All which said purposes are meant and intended to be carried into effect within the Parishes of Tolbooth, High Church, College Kirk, Tron Kirk, Lady Yester's, Old Kirk, New North, Old Greyfriars, New Greyfriars, St. Andrew's, St. George's, St. Mary's, St. Stephen's, Greenside, in the Ancient and Extended Royalty of the said City, and Canongate, South Leith, and St. Cuthbert's, Duddingston, and Liberton,—all in the County of Edinburgh, or some of them.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT application is intended to be made to Parliament in next Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to continue, explain, alter, amend, and enlarge certain of the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the third year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, entitled 'An Act for erecting a Bridewell for the County of Lanark and City of Glasgow;' and of another Act passed in the fifth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled 'An Act for amending an Act passed in the third year of the reign of his present Majesty for erecting a Bridewell for the County of Lanark and City of Glasgow;' as also the powers and provisions as far as the same relate to the said Bridewell, of an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intitled 'An Act for erecting and maintaining a Justiciary Court Hall and other apartments for the use of the Justiciary Court at Glasgow, and also Public Offices for the City of Glasgow and the Lower Ward of the County of Lanark, and for other purposes therein mentioned,' and to enable the Commissioners acting under the authority of the said recited Acts to raise a further sum of money for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense already incurred in the erection of the said Bridewell, and in the execution of the powers of the said recited Acts, and to be incurred until the said Bridewell be transferred to the County Board of Directors of Prisons for Lanarkshire, in virtue of an Act passed in the third year of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled 'An Act to improve prisons and prison discipline in Scotland,' and for the foresaid purposes, it is intended, by the said Bill, to authorise the continuance for such time as may be necessary, of the assessment and rates granted by the said first three recited Acts, or to alter the said assessment and rates, and to impose a new or additional assessment, or new or additional rates upon the Lands, Buildings, and other heritages and subjects in the Lower Ward of the County of Lanark, and in the City and Royalty and extended Royalty of Glasgow, which are at present assessable under the powers and provisions of the said first three recited Acts.
