instant, at five A.M. Cape Clear N.E. twenty leagues, I captured *Le Mars*, a stout fast sailing privateer, from Nantes, pierced for 20 guns, had mounted 12 twelves, 2 eighteens, and 2 twelve pound carronades, with 220 men: Had been out 49 days, and had not captured any thing.
