I request you will lay before their Lordships the accompanying letter to me from Lord A. Beauclerk, giving an account of his having captured and brought in here Le Mars, of Nantes, a new coppered ship privateer, mounting 16 guns and 220 men.

instant, at five A.M. Cape Clear N.E. twenty leagues, I captured Le Mars, a stout fast failing privateer, from Nantes, pierced for 20 guns, had mounted 12 twelves, 2 eighteens, and 2 twelve pound carronades, with 220 men: Had been out 49 days, and had not captured any thing.
