Copy of a letter from the Earl of ST VINCENT, K. B. Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels employed on the coast of Portugal, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated on board the Ville de Paris, in the Tagus, Jan. 31. 1798.

I Enclose a letter from Captain-Rogers, of his Majesty's ship the Mercury, acquainting me with his having captured La Constance French privateer, of 18 guns, the third taken by that ship since her arrival from Newfoundland. I have the honour to be, &c:
ST VINCENTES

His Majesty's ship Mercury, at sea. January 25: 1798.

I Have the honour to inform your Lordship, that this day at noon, the Burlings bearing S. E. 42 leagues, I fell in with La Constance French brig privateer, belonging to Nantz, which I captured after a chace of five hours; the is a remarkable fine vessel, pierced for 18 guns, but has only 12 fix and nine-pounders on board, and 96 men, copper-bottomed, quite new, fails very falt, and is only ten days from Nantz, on a cruize off the Western Islands.
