THIS day the Count de Pollon, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sardinia, had an audience of Her Majesty, on his return from a leave of absence: To which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.
