Copy of a letter from Lieut. Wollaston, commanding his Majesty's cutter Cruizer, to Vice Admiral Sir Richard Onslow, Bart. dated at sea, the 27th of last month.

Agreeable to your fignal, I gave chace to the S.W. and, after a chace of three hours, came up with and captured the French lugger privateer Jupiter, mounting eight carriage guns, and manned with 36 men, out fourteen days from Boulogne.
