Copy of a letter from Rear-Admiral Harvey, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at the Leeward Islands, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated on board the Prince of Wales, Fort Royal Bay, Martinique, June 12, 1798.

I Have to acquaint you, for the information of their Lordships, that fince my letter to you of the 13th ult. the under mentioned French privateers, belonging to Guadaloupe, have been captured at the periods, and by the ships and vessels of his Majesty's squadron un-der my command, as against their names expressed.

By the Matilda, Captain Mitford, 29th ult. to windward of Antigua, I.'Annibal brig of 14 guns and 97 men. By the Lapwing, Captain Harvey, 29th ult. off St Bartholomew's, L'Intrepid floop, of 10 guns and 38 men. By the Charlotte armed floop, commanded by Lieut. John Williams, 29th ult. off Dominica, La Mart schooner, of 4 guns and 36 men.

Neither of the above privateers had made any cap-tures fince their leaving Guadaloupe.
