Is *Thirty-Seven Shillings and Four Pence Halfpenny* per Hundred Weight;

The AVERAGE PRICE of the Three foregoing descriptions of SUGAR, jointly,

Computed as above, and Exclusive of Duty,

Is *Thirty-Six Shillings and Eleven Pence Halfpenny* per Hundred Weight.
