At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23d day of May 1844,

PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Sir Thomas Francis Fremantle, Bart. was, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

WHITEHALL, May 21, 1844.

The Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, constituting and appointing the Right Honourable Sir Robert Peel, Bart.; the Right Honourable Henry Goulburn; James Milnes Gaskell, Esq.; Henry Bingham Baring, Esq.; Alexander Pringle, Esq.; and Arthur Lennox, Esq. (commonly called Lord Arthur Lennox), to be Commissioners for executing the offices of Treasurer of the Exchequer of Great Britain and Lord High Treasurer of Ireland.

WESTMINSTER, May 23, 1844.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that the Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to  
An Act to rectify a mistake as to the proceedings on the Eastern Counties' Railway Bill, and the Eastern Counties' Railway (Brandon and Peterborough Extension) Bill.  
And several English, and two private Acts.
