HEREWITHOYOU will receive a copy of a letter from Sir Edward Pellew, of his Majesty's ship Indefatigable, addreffed to Vice Admiral Sir Alan Gardner, ffating the capture of the French national corvette La Vail-I am, &c. BRIDPORT.

Indefatigable, at Sea, August 8. 1798.

I HAVE great pleafure in communicating to you the capture of the French national corrette La Vaillante, commanded by the Lieutenant de Vaisseau La Porte, mounting twenty guns, nine pounders, pierced for twenty two, and manned with one hundred and feventy-

This ship sailed from Rochesort the 1st, and from ed priests, twenty seven convicts, and Madame Rovere and family, for Cayenne. We fell in with her at day-break on the 7th, between Bourdeaux and the isle of Rhe, and the chace continued twenty-four hours, when fhe struck after siring a few guns. She is of large di-mensions, only eighteen months old, coppered and cop-per sastened, sails sast, and will, I trust, be sound sit for his Majesty's service. I have the honor to be, &c.
