Extract of a letter from the Right Hon. Lord BRIDPORT, K. B. Admiral of the White, &c. to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated on board his Majesty's ship Royal George, at sea, the 30th of August, 1798.

YOU will receive herewith copies of letters from Captain Pierrepont, of the Naiad, stating the capture of the French Settee privateer La Tigre.

*His Majesty's ship Naiad, at sea,
18th August 1798.*

MY LORD,

By La Tigre French privateer, captured by his Majesty's ship under my command on the 11th instant, I have the honour to transmit your Lordship a copy of a letter written by me to Captain de Courcy on that occasion; but not having been able to communicate with the Magnanime since, I have thought it right to make known unto you myself, by the opportunity which offers, the capture of the privateer.

SIR,

I BEG to make known to you, for the information of the Admiral Lord Bridport, that yesterday at five P. M. Cape Finisterre bearing E. S. E. 42 leagues distant, I captured in his Majesty's ship under my command, after a chase of four hours, the French settee privateer La Tigre, mounting eight carriage guns, four pounders, and eight swivels, bearing a complement of fifty-three men; twenty-two of that number had been sent into different vessels captured by Stephen Bonaventure Aggaret, the Commander of La Tigre, since

his sailing from Groire ten days ago. I have the honour to be, &c.

AT a meeting of these creditors held upon the 17th day of August last, Robert Peddie, writer in Perth, was named trustee on the sequestrated estate of the said William Panton; and his appointment having since been confirmed by the Court of Session, he made application to the Sheriff of Perth, who appointed Wednesday the 19th day of Sept. curt. and Thursday the 4th day of October next at eleven o'clock forenoon, within the Sheriff Court Room of Perth, for the public examination of the bankrupt, upon the state of his affairs and all circumstances relative thereto, of which intimation is hereby given. And further, the trustee hereby intimates, that upon Friday the 5th day of October next, at twelve o'clock noon, a meeting of the creditors is to be held within the house of Thomas Wakefield, vintner in Perth, for the purpose of instructing the trustee as to the management of the sequestrated estate; and also the trustee does hereby require such of the creditors as have not already lodged their grounds of debt and oaths of verity thereon, to do so betwixt and the sixteenth day of May next, being ten months from the date of the sequestration; certifying those who do not comply with this requisition, that they will have no share in the first distribution of the debtor's estates.
