A PROCLAMATION,

GEORGE R.

Whereas, our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the 23d day of October next; We, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the faid 23d day of October, to Tuesday the 6th day of Novem. ber, 1798; and We have given order to our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a commission for proroguing the fame accordingly; And we do hereby declare our royal will and pleasure, that the faid Parliament shall, on the faid 6th day of November, 1798, be held for the difpatch of divers weighty and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give attendance accordingly at Westminster on the faid 6th day of November, 1798.

Given at our Court at Weymouth, the 28th day of September, 1798, in the 38th year of our reign. GOD SAVE THE KING.

At the Court at Weymouth the 28th of September 1798, PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.
This day, the Right Honourable William Schaw Lord
Cathcart was, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his
Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his
place at the Board accordingly.

WHITEHALL, SEPT. I. 1798.

DUBLIN-CASTLE, SEPT. 28. 1798.

Saturday being the anniversary of their Majesties coronation, at noon the great guns in his Majesty's park the Phœnix were fired three rounds, and answered by vollies from the regiments in garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the barracks. In the evening a play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the entertainment of the ladies; and at night there were bonsires, illuminations, and every other demonstration of joy.
