The Queen has been pleased to approve of Adolphe Baron de Maussion, as Consul at Edinburgh for His Majesty the King of the French.

WESTMINSTER, March 18, 1847.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that the Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight millions out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

An Act for raising the sum of eight millions by way of Annuities.

An Act to render valid certain proceedings for the relief of distress in Ireland, by employment of the labouring poor, and to indemnify those who have acted in such proceedings.

An Act to change the name of the Protestant Dissenters and General Life and Fire Insurance Company, to the General Life and Fire Assurance Company, and to extend to the Company, by its new name, the powers of the Act enabling the Company to sue and be sued in the name of the chairman, deputy-chairman, or any one of the directors, or of the secretary of the Company.
