THE Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, constituting and appointing the Right Honourable George Earl of Auckland, G.C.B. Rear-Admiral James Whitley Deans Dundas, Rear-Admiral Henry Prescott, Captain Maurice Frederick Fitzhardinge Berkeley, Captain John Hay (commonly called Lord John Hay), C.B. and the Honourable William Francis Cowper, Her Majesty's Commissioners for executing the office of High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the dominions, islands, and territories thereunto belonging.

We, the undersigned, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint the following place to be a legal quay, within the port of Glasgow, for the lading and unlading of goods, and do hereby declare the bounds and extent of such quay to be as follows, that is to say, all that open place, quay, or wharf, measuring five hundred and nineteen feet in length by eighty feet in breadth, situated on the north side of

the harbour of Glasgow, from Glasgow-bridge eastward, to the spot lately occupied by a bridge, called the Accommodation Bridge, and now bounded on the east by a stone, marked "Limit, Eastward, of the Legal Quay, 1847," and on the north by Great Clyde Street.
