We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do, under authority of an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," hereby annul, from and after

the fifth day of July next, the limits of the port of Leith, as set out and appointed by a Return, dated the twenty-third day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, to a Commission issued out of the Court of Exchequer, at Edinburgh, dated nineteenth day of December preceding, in so far as the said limits include the town or village and creek of Eyemouth, and that part of the coast of Berwickshire adjoining thereto, which extends from the promontory or point of land, called Saint Abb's Head, to the place called the Bound Road, lying about three miles north of the town of Berwick; and we do hereby, under authority of the said Act, from and after the said fifth day of July next, annex to the port of Berwick-upon-Tweed, the said town or village and creek of Eyemouth, and the coast from Saint Abb's Head to the said Bound Road; and we do declare, that the same shall, from and after the said day, be within, and form part of the limits of the said port of Berwick-upon-Tweed, and shall extend to seaward from the said Bound Road to a point opposite thereto, in a right line from the shore about one mile, and from thence, north eastward, to a point bearing due east from Saint Abb's Head four leagues.
