LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S-OFFICE, January 7, 1848.

**ORDERS** for the Court's going into Mourning, on Sunday next the 9th instant, for Her late Majesty the Arch-Duchess Duchess of Parma, viz.—

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and earrings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday the 13th instant, viz.—

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Sunday the 16th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.
