BUCKINGHAM-PALACE, March 4, 1848.

This day had audience of Her Majesty, His Royal Highness the Count of Syracuse, attended by the Prince de Castelcicala, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty the King of the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies :

His Royal Highness was introduced by Viscount Palmerston, G. C. B. Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Colonel the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K. C. H. Master of the Ceremonies.

WESTMINSTER, March 7, 1847.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the

Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight millions out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

An Act to suspend for five years the operation of certain parts of an Act, of the tenth year of Her present Majesty, for making further provision for the government of the New Zealand Islands, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.
