LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S OFFICE, February 18, 1848.

NOTICE is hereby given, that his Royal Highness Prince Albert will, by the desire of Her Majesty, hold a Levee, at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday the 22d March instant, at two o'clock.

It is Her Majesty's pleasure, that presentations to His Royal Highness at these Levees shall be considered equivalent to presentations to the Queen.

Addresses to the Queen may either be forwarded to Her Majesty, through the Secretary of State for the Home Department, or may be reserved until Her Majesty shall hold a Levee.

BUCKINGHAM-PALACE, March 4, 1848.

This day had audience of Her Majesty, His Royal Highness the Count of Syracuse, attended by the Prince de Castelcicala, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty the King of the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies :

His Royal Highness was introduced by Viscount Palmerston, G. C. B. Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Colonel the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K. C. H. Master of the Ceremonies.

ST. JAMES'S PALACE, February 11, 1848.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint George-Hamilton Marquess of Donegal to be Captain of Her Majesty's Guard of Yeomen of the Guard, in the room of Lucius-Bentinck Viscount Falkland, resigned.

WHITEHALL, March 9, 1848.

The Queen has been pleased to direct letters-patent to be passed under the Great Seal, nominating and appointing Benjamin Currey, Esq. to be Clerk Assistant of the Parliaments, in the room of John William Birch, Esq. resigned.

DOWNING-STREET, March 10, 1848.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint James Watson Sheriff, Esq. to be Her Majesty's Attorney-General for the Islands of Antigua and Montserrat, and John Somers Martin, Esq. to be Coroner for the Island of Antigua.

Her Majesty has also been pleased to appoint John H. Jennings, Esq. to be Commissary of Police for the Island of St. Lucia.

WESTMINSTER, March 7, 1847.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the

Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight millions out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

An Act to suspend for five years the operation of certain parts of an Act, of the tenth year of Her present Majesty, for making further provision for the government of the New Zealand Islands, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.
