THE following Address of congratulation to the Queen, on the occasion of the Birth of another Princess, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Home Department, for presentation, was presented accordingly to Her Majesty, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:

> Unto Her Most Gracious Majesty the QUEEN.

May it please your Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbytery of Edinburgh, beg to approach your Majesty's Throne, with the expression of our sincere and deep attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government, and of our thankfulness to Almighty God for His goodness in encreasing your Majesty's domestic comforts and the number of the Royal Family by the birth of a Princess, and for preserving your Majesty's valuable life to your family and people.

That your Majesty may ever enjoy the blessing of the King of kings, and may long reign over a people distinguished for loyalty and that righteousness which exalteth a nation; and that finally your Majesty, and all who are dear to you, may enjoy eternal felicity in the kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ, is the
