The Funeral Pr cession reached the Cemetery, Kensal Green, at seven o'clock A.M. His Royal Highness Prince Albert, attended by the Marquis of Abercorn, K.G., Lord George Lennox, Colonel William Wylde, C.B., and Colonel Everard-William Bouverie.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, attended by Major Baron Knesebeck and Edmond St. John Mildmay, Esq.

His Royal Highness Prince George of Cambridge ; Count Kielmansegge, the Hanoverian Minister; Earl Spencer, C. B. Lord Chamber-lain of Her Majesty's Household; the Bishop of Norwich, Clerk of the Closet to the Queen; the Very Rev. John Merewether, D. D. Dean of Hereford, and Deputy-Clerk of the Closet to the Queen in Waiting ; and the Reverend Evan Nepean, Chaplain in Attendance upon Her late Royal Highness, met the Funeral at the Chapel of the lemetery.

Upon arrival within the Chapel, the Body was placed on the Bier, and the Burial Service commenced, the Clerk of the Closet officiating, assisted by the Deputy Clerk of the Clo-et.

The Chief Mourner sat at the head of the Corpse, with her Attendant; the Ladies of the Royal Family on either side the Bier, the Lady of the Bedchamber and the Bedchamber Woman of Her late Royal Highness nearest the head of the Corpse. His Royal Highness Prince Albert, His Royal Highness the Duke

of Cambridge, and his Royal Highness Prince George of Cambridge, sat near the Chief Mourner.

The Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household stood at the foot of the Corpse, the Vice Chamberlain and Sir William Martins on either side.

The remainder of those present proceeded into the pews. The part of the Service before the Interment being read, the Coffin was deposited in the Vault beneath the Chapel, and the Clerk of the Closet then concluded the Service.

After which His Royal Highness Prince Albert, His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, and His Royal Highness Prince George of Cambridge, were conducted by the Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household out of the Chapel, followed by the Attendants and others pres\_nt at the Solemnity.
