Copy of a letter from Sir Edward Pellew, Bart. Captain of his Majesty's ship Indefatigable, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated at sea the 2d inst. SIR,

HAVING an opportunity of forwarding a duplicate of my letter and return to Sir Alan Gardner, by the recaptured ship Asphalon, which proceeds to Falmouth, whilst the Indefatigable proceeds to join the Vice-Ad-

I fend this for their Lordships information, and remain, Sir, &c. EDWARD PELLEW.

Indefatigable, at fea, Jan. 1. I have the pleasure to inform you, that at dawn of day yesterday morning, Ushant bearing N. E. five leagues, we captured the French ship privateer La Minerve, carrying 16 guns and 140 men, 28 days from St Malo. She was lying-to, waiting to proceed into Brest, and took this ship for her prize, the Asphalon, of Newcastle, from Halifax bound to London, laden with fugar, coffee, and tobacco; which ship we chaced all day, and this morning had the fatisfaction to retake off the rocks of Albrevrak.

I have the honour to inclose a list of vessels captured by the privateer during her cruize.
