Copy of a letter from Sir EDWARD PELLEW, Bart. Captain of his Majesty's ship *Indefatigable*, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated at sea the 2d inst.

SIR,

HAVING an opportunity of forwarding a duplicate of my letter and return to Sir Alan Gardner, by the recaptured ship *Asphalon*, which proceeds to Falmouth, whilst the *Indefatigable* proceeds to join the Vice-Admiral off Brest.

I send this for their Lordships information, and remain, Sir, &c.

SIR,

Indefatigable, at sea, Jan. 1.

I have the pleasure to inform you, that at dawn of day yesterday morning, *Ushant* bearing N. E. five leagues, we captured the French ship privateer *La Minerve*, carrying 16 guns and 140 men, 28 days from St Malo. She was lying-to, waiting to proceed into Brest, and took this ship for her prize, the *Asphalon*, of Newcastle, from Halifax bound to London, laden with sugar, coffee, and tobacco; which ship we chased all day, and this morning had the satisfaction to retake off the rocks of Albrevrak.

I have the honour to inclose a list of vessels captured by the privateer during her cruise.

Minerva, English sloop, from Providence to London, with sugar, coffee, and cotton.
