Copy of a letter from Admiral Lord BRIDPORT, K.B. Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels employed in the Channel; to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated Bath, Jan. 18.

SIR,
Inclosed is a copy of a letter from Captain Cunningham, of his Majesty's ship Clyde, which I transmit to you for their Lordships information.

BRIDPORT.

My Lord, Clyde, Cawland Bay, Jan. 15.

I have the honour to inform you, that on the 10th instant, his Majesty's ship Clyde, under my command, captured L'Air schooner letter of marque, from Breff to St Domingo; and on the 13th, a brig privateer, called Le Bon Ordre, carrying 16 guns and 65 men. She sailed from Granville on the 20th December, and had captured one brig from Newfoundland on the 6th instant.
