FOREIGN-OFFICE, March 23, 1849.

It is hereby notified that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, stating that he had received from the Danish Minister a Notice that all the ports of Holstein and Schleswig, with the exception of Als and Æræ, will be blockaded on and after the 27th of the present month.

The Notice is as follows :

"The Minister of the Navy hereby makes known, that all Harbours and Ports in the Duchies of Schleswig and Holstein, will, from the 27th of this month, be blockaded, excepting of course the Islands of Als and Ære, and such other places as are actually under the Royal Government.

"The blockade will be raised for every place returning under the lawful Government; and special notice will be given whenever such places are excepted from the blockade."
