INDIA BOARD, April 2, 1849.

THE following Dispatch has been this day received at the India-House from the Governor of Bombay in Council.

The Governor in Council of Bombay to the Secret Committee of the East India Company.

*Bombay, March 4, 1849, 5 P.M.*

We have much gratification in informing you that, late last evening, we received by express, a letter from Mr Elliot, Secretary to the Government of India, dated the 23d ultimo, forwarding for publication in the official Gazette of this Presidency, the following Notification, issued on the same day, by order of the Governor-General of India, announcing the rout of the Sikh Army, under Rajah Shere Sing, on the 21st of the same month.

NOTIFICATION.

*Camp, Ferozepore, February 23, 1849.*

The Governor-General has the gratification of intimating to the President in Council, and notifying for public information, that he has this day received a dispatch from Major Mackeson, C.B. Agent to the Governor-General, with the Commander-in-Chief, conveying the intelligence, that the forces under His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, on the 21st instant, attacked and routed the Sikh Army in the neighbourhood of Goojerat.

2. The enemy was beaten at every point, and retreated in disorder, leaving in the hands of the British troops, by whom he was pursued, a great portion of his artillery, his ammunition, and the whole of his standing camp.

3. The official dispatches of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief will be published as soon as they are received.

4. The Governor-General directs, that a salute of twenty-one guns shall be fired at every principal station of the army, on the receipt of this Notification.

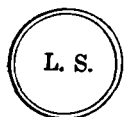
