The Queen taking into Her royal consideration, that upon the death of George Alan, late Viscount Midleton, without issue, on or about the 1st day of November 1848, the dignity of Viscount Midleton devolved upon Charles, now Viscount Midleton, as eldest son and heir of the Most Reverend Charles Brodrick, sometime Archbishop of Cashel, deceased brother of George, fourth Viscount Midleton, father of the said George Alan, late Viscount Midleton; whereby the younger brothers and sisters of the said Charles, now Viscount Midleton, cannot, according to the ordinary rules of honour, enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father, the said Most Reverend Charles Brodrick, Archbishop of Cashel, survived his nephew, the said George Alan, late Viscount Midleton, and thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Viscount Midleton; Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare, that George Brodrick Clerk; William John Brodrick Clerk; Albinia, widow of the Honourable James Ashley Maude; Louisa, wife of James Smyth Scott, Esquire; and Francis, widow of Henry Dunbar Tolley, late a Major-General in the Army, and Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, deceased, the younger brothers and sisters of the said Charles, now Viscount Midleton, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father survived his said nephew George Alan, late Viscount Midleton, and succeeded to the said title and dignity of Viscount Midleton:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command, that the said royal order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

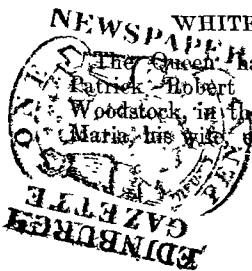
