HER Most Gracious Majesty THE QUEEN, accompanied by His Royal Highness The PRINCE ALBERT, and Their Royal Highnesses The PRINCE OF WALES, The PRINCESS ROYAL, PRINCESS ALICE, and PRINCE ALFRED, and Suite, left Balmoral Castle this Morning at Eight o'Clock, and arrived at Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood this Evening at Seven o'Clock.

## NOTIFICATION.

FOREIGN-OFFICE, October 8, 1850.

IT is hereby notified that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, Despatches dated respectively the 27th ultimo and the 3d instant, inclosing communications from the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, of the following tenor:—

*Copenhagen,*

*September 21, 1850.*

M. le Chevalier,  
Experience having shown that the free navigation of the Eyder might easily be used to the detriment of the army of the King my August Master, the Commander-in-Chief of the Danish Troops has been authorised to prohibit all navigation of that river if military reasons should render such a step necessary.

In communicating this decision to you, M. le Chevalier, I have to request that you will bring it to the knowledge of your Government.

*M. de Reedtz to Sir Henry Wynn.*

M. le Chevalier,

With reference to the official note which I had the honour to address to you on the 21st instant, I have to inform you, that according to information which I have received, the Commander-in-Chief of the Danish Forces has been obliged to make use of the authority given to him to prohibit the navigation of the Eyder.

In order to afford, as far as possible, every facility to the navigation of friendly and neutral Powers, the Government of the King my August Master has, in the meantime, hastened to allow neutral merchant ships coming from the Baltic to leave that river until the 10th of October inclusive, and orders to that effect have been issued to the competent authorities.

With respect to vessels coming from the North Sea, I have the honour to observe to you, that the Port of Tönningen not being closed, masters of vessels may discharge their cargoes there, unless they should prefer to pursue their voyage by the Sound.

bell Smith, and finding that he is descended from  
the said Richard Smith, brother to the said Captain

recorded his said pedigree of descent in my office,  
I do acknowledge and confirm his said re-assump-
