WHITEHALL, October 17, 1850.

THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Peter Laurie, of Park Square, Regent's Park, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, and of Lincoln's-Inn, Barrister-at-Law, in the Commission of the Peace, and a Deputy Lieutenant for the said county, Her royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a request contained in a codicil to the last will and testament of Catherine Jack, late of Sloane Street, in the parish of Chelsea, in the said county of Middlesex, Spinster, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Northall, in addition to and before that of Laurie, and that he and they may bear the arms of Northall quarterly with those of Laurie; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
