**Eastbourne Union.—Eastbourne Parish.**

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Eastbourne, in the county of Sussex ;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate ;

And to all others whom it may concern.

**W**HEREAS the population of the parish of Eastbourne, in the county of Sussex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons ; And whereas at a meeting of the vestry of the said parish, held, after public notice in that behalf, on the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, it was resolved,—

That the Churchwardens be authorized to make application to the Poor-Law Board for an Order that the 13 and 14 Vict. c. 57, intituled "The Vestries and Vestry Clerks' Act," or any part thereof, shall be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Eastbourne ;

That the Churchwardens be authorized to make application to the Poor-Law Board for an Order to provide a place for holding vestry meetings within the parish ;

And that the Churchwardens be authorized to make application to the Poor-Law Board for an Order to elect a Vestry Clerk for that parish.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the said Poor-Law Board, pursuant to the above Resolutions.

Now therefore, we, the said Poor-Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct that the whole of the Act passed in the

fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within such parish.

And we do hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
