**N**OTICE is hereby given, that Her Majesty will hold a Levee at St James's-Palace, on Wednesday, 26th March current, at two o'clock.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE, at ST JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levee at St James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Monday previous* to the Levee, *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at the Levee but in conformity with the above Regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The State Apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until half-past one o'clock.

Some irregularities having taken place, notice is hereby given, that no Officer of the Army or Navy, nor any Civilian, to be presented to the Queen at the Levee, can be admitted to the State Apartments for that purpose, whose presentation card has not been previously sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, according to the above Regulations.

The name of any Gentleman not adhering to the Regulation, must be excluded from the presentation book, and the reason entered for so doing; viz.—The Contravention of the Regulations.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to send a card (having on it their

names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come) to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, on the *Monday previous* to the Levee; and that two other cards, having on them precisely what is written upon that sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, are to be taken to the Levee; one of the two cards to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to Her Majesty; and on these occasions no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.
