A PROCLAMATION.

CLARENDON.

WHEREAS in pursuance and execution of an  
Act passed in the eleventh year of the  
reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act  
for the better prevention of Crime and Outrage  
in certain parts of Ireland, until the First day of  
December, One thousand eight hundred and forty-  
nine, and to the end of the then next Session of  
Parliament," We did, by Our two several Pro-  
clamations, bearing date respectively the Eighteenth  
day of July, One thousand eight hundred and forty-  
eight, Declare, that from and after the Twenty-  
second day of the said month of July, One thousand  
eight hundred and forty-eight, the said Act should  
apply to, and be in force in the County of the City  
of Waterford, and County of the Town of Drogheda.

And whereas by Four other several Proclama-  
tions, in execution of the said Act, bearing date  
respectively the Thirty-first day of July, One  
thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, We did  
Declare, that from and after the Second day of  
August then next ensuing, the said Act should  
apply to, and be in force in the Counties of Carlow,  
Kildare, Wexford, and Wicklow.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said  
several Proclamations of the Eighteenth and  
Thirty-first of July aforesaid.

Now We, the Lord Lieutenant, Do, by this Our  
Proclamation, by and with the advice of Her Ma-  
jesty's Privy Council in Ireland, declare that from  
and after the date hereof, the said several Procla-  
mations shall stand and be revoked.

And of this our Proclamation all Justices of the  
Peace, of the said Counties, and Counties of Cities

and Towns, Constables, Peace Officers, and all  
others whom it may concern, are to take Notice.
