You will be pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that Captain Barton, of his Majesty's ship Concorde, captured on the 14th ult. to windward of Antigua, La. Prudent French ship privateer, copper bottomed, of 18 guns and 100 men. She had been cruizing to wind-. ward of Barbadoes for fix weeks; without making any other captures than two schooners, one from Halifax, and the other an American, and was on her return to the Spanish port of Saint Domingo, where she belonged, and from whence the had failed early in December laft.

Arch. Dickson. Sir, Aftrea at sea, April 13. 1799. I beg leave to acquaint you, that on the 10th instant, the Texel bearing east nine or ten leagues, I fell in with and captured, after a chace of three hours, Le Marfouin French lugger privateer, of 14 guns and 58 men.
