The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Frederick Charles Trench, of Parlington, in the parish of Aberford, in the West Riding of the county of York, Esq. and unto Mary Isabella, his wife, eldest of the two daughters and co-heirs of Richard Oliver Gascoigne, (formerly Richard Oliver,) late of Parlington aforesaid, Esq. deceased, Her royal licence and authority that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Gascoigne, in addition to and after that of Trench, that he, the said Frederick Charles Trench, may bear the arms of Gascoigne quarterly with those of his own family, and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:
