THIS day had audience of Her Majesty :—
The Prince di Carini, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies, to deliver his credentials ;

And Lieutenant-General Sir Julius Hartmann, K.C.B., on a Special Mission to deliver a letter from the King of Hanover, notifying the death of the late King, and announcing his own accession to the Throne ;

To which they were respectively introduced by Viscount Palmerston, G.C.B., Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Robert Duncan Wilmot, Esq. to be Surveyor-General for the Province of New Brunswick.

In pursuance of the directions of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes :"

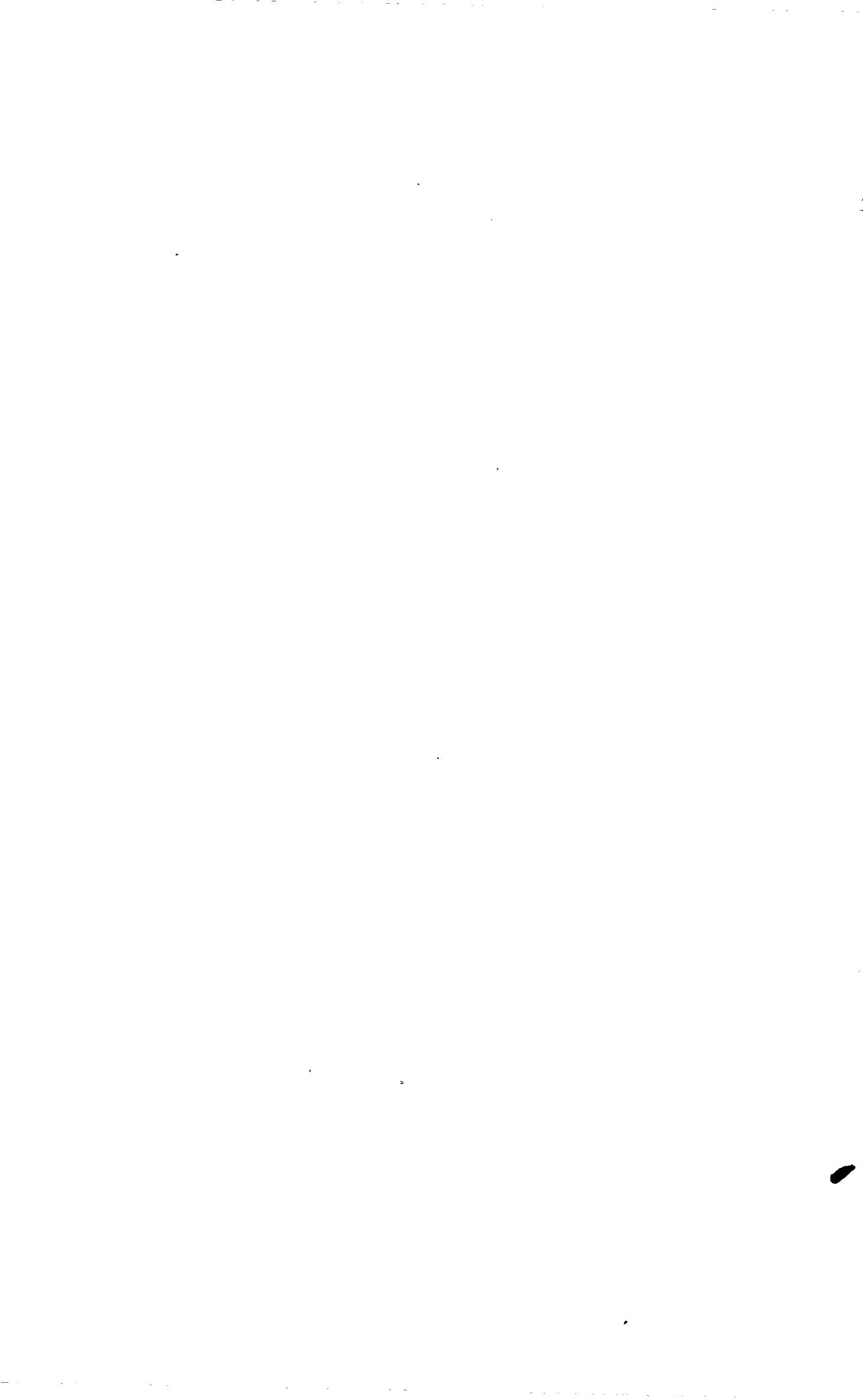
