

Sunday, or on a day appointed for public fast or thanksgiving, then that such one-third shall go out of office on the day next following.

5. That every person at the time of his election as member of the said Local Board, and so long as he shall continue in office by virtue of such election, be resident, as in the said Public Health Act, 1848, is required, and be seized or possessed of real or personal estate, or both, to the value or amount of not less than five hundred pounds, or shall be so resident and rated to the relief of the poor of some parish, township, or place, of which some part is within the said district, upon an annual value of not less than fifteen pounds.

6. That at the first election of the said Local Board, Thomas Langton Birley, Esquire, Merchant, of Kirkham aforesaid, shall have the powers and perform the duties vested in or imposed upon the Chairman of the Local Board of Health by the Public Health Act, 1848, in relation to the election by owners of property and rate-payers, and shall perform all other duties which it may be requisite for him to perform in conducting and completing the said first election; and in case the said Thomas Langton Birley, from illness or other sufficient cause, shall be unable to exercise or discharge such powers or duties, or shall be absent, or shall refuse to act, then Richard Moore, Esquire, the younger, of Kirkham aforesaid, shall exercise and perform such of the said powers and duties as then remain to be exercised or performed.

7. That the fourteen days' notice of qualification required by the Public Health Act, 1848, to be given by owners of property, in order to entitle them to vote at the said first election, shall be given to the said Thomas Langton Birley, at his residence, Carr Hill, Kirkham, within the district aforesaid; or in case he shall refuse, or be unable to receive the same, then to the said Richard Moore, the younger, at his residence in Church Street, likewise within the aforesaid district.

Whereas the population of the parish of Solihull, in the county of Warwick, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday the fourteenth day of November last, it was unanimously resolved—

That the Churchwardens of the parish of Solihull be requested, and they are by this Vestry authorised, to make an application in writing to the Commissioners for the Relief of the Poor in England, to make an Order that the Act passed in the 13th and 14th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of vestry or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of vestry clerks," be applied to, and be put in force in this parish, so far as the said Act applies to the appointment of a vestry clerk.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above Resolution:

Now therefore, We, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct that so much of the said Act as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Solihull.

And We do hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
