At the Court at Windsor, the 10th day of January 1852,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the eleventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, establishing Regulations touching the trade and commerce to and from Her Majesty's Island of Saint Helena, certain goods therein enumerated or described are prohibited or restricted to be imported into the said Island; and whereas the importation of oil is prohibited except from the United Kingdom or from some other British possession, or unless taken by British ships fitted out from the United Kingdom, or from some other British possession, and brought in from the fishery:

And Whereas, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth deem it expedient to allow the free importation of oil into Her Majesty's Island of Saint Helena, Her Majesty doth therefore, with the advice of Her Privy Council, order that so much of Her Majesty's Order in Council aforesaid, dated the eleventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, as restricts the importation of oil into the Island of Saint Helena be repealed, and the same is hereby repealed.

And it is hereby farther ordered that the Governor, or the Officer for the time being administering the government of the said Island, shall, and is hereby required to promulgate this present Order within one calendar month next after the receipt thereof by him, and this Order shall take effect within the said Island of Saint Helena, and have the force of law there, from and after the date of such promulgation thereof as aforesaid, and not before.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above Resolution :

Now therefore, We, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct as follows ; that is to say :—

ART. 1. That so much of the aforesaid Act as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Lyncombe and Widcombe.

ART. 2. That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
