NOTICE is hereby given, that Her Majesty will hold a Drawing-Room, at St James's Palace, on Thursday the 3d of June next, at two o'clock.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOM.

The Ladies who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing-Room are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *legibly* written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

And those Ladies who are to be presented at the Drawing-Room on the 3d of June next, are hereby informed that it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office on *Tuesday the 1st of June next, before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which name shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that in every case *written cards only* be delivered.

The Queen has been pleased to constitute the colony of Sierra Leone, and its dependencies, to be a Bishop's See or Diocese, to be called "The Bishoprick of Sierra Leone," the said See or Diocese to consist of and to comprise all Her Majesty's colonies, territories, and possessions, with their dependencies, on the West Coast of Africa, situate within and between the 20th degree of north and the 20th degree of south latitude, and especially Her Majesty's colonies of Sierra Leone, of the Gambia, and of the Gold Coast, with their dependencies; and Her Majesty has further been pleased to name and appoint the Reverend Owen Emeric Vidal, Master of Arts, to be ordained and consecrated Bishop of the said See or Diocese.

WHITEHALL, May 18, 1852.

The Queen has been pleased to grant the place of one of the Lords of Session in Scotland to Adam Anderson, Esq. Her Majesty's Advocate for Scotland, in the room of Duncan McNeill, Esq. resigned.

The Queen has also been pleased to nominate and appoint the said Adam Anderson to be one of the Lords of Justiciary in Scotland, in the room of the said Duncan McNeill.

The Queen has been pleased to grant the office of Her Majesty's Advocate for Scotland to John Inglis, Esq. Her Majesty's Solicitor-General for Scotland, in the room of Adam Anderson, Esq. appointed a Lord of Session and of Justiciary in Scotland.

WHITEHALL, May 20, 1852.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Edward Kitchen and George Brinwood Potts, Gentlemen, to be Lieutenants in the Artillery Company of London.

WHITEHALL, May 20, 1852.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Henry Carington Bowles Treacher, only son of Edward Treacher, of Albert Terrace, in the parish of Saint Pancras, in the county of Middlesex, Gentleman, by Anne Sarah, his wife, eldest daughter of Henry Carington Bowles, of Myddelton House, in the parish of Enfield, in the said county of Middlesex, Gentleman, and sister of Henry Carington Bowles, of the same place, Esq. deceased, late in the Commission of the Peace for the aforesaid county, Her royal licence and authority that, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of his maternal uncle, the said Henry Carington Bowles, deceased, he and his issue may henceforth take, and use, and bear the surname of Bowles only, and take, and use, and bear the arms of Bowles alone; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
