ADMIRALTY, June 24, 1852.

WITH reference to the Admiralty Notice respecting Lights to be carried by sea-going vessels, to prevent collision, dated the 1st of May 1852, which appeared in the London Gazette on the 4th, 7th, and 11th of that month, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having had under their consideration that paragraph of the same which states that

“Patterns of the Lanterns to be carried, and of the mode in which the screens are to be fitted, may be seen at the Custom-Houses of the principal commercial ports of the United Kingdom,”

hereby give notice, that in order to prevent the delay and inconvenience which might be experienced by those persons who are affected by the Regulation in supplying themselves with lanterns of any one fixed pattern, and from any one party, they revoke the intention of sending patterns to the various Custom-Houses, and leave all persons to furnish themselves with whatever description of lantern they may see fit to adopt, so long as the other conditions of the above stated Regulations are effectually carried out.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth, in the county of Surrey ;

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate ;

And to all Others whom it may concern.

Whereas the population of the parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth, in the county of Surrey, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons,

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after due notice, on the twenty-ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and by adjournment on the three following days, for the following purpose, it was resolved,—

That having heard read the Report of the Committee of the 8th August 1851, an application be made to the Commissioners for administering the laws for Relief of the Poor in England, to make an Order, under their seal of office, that so much of a certain Act of Parliament made and passed in the 13th and 14th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of vestry or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of vestry clerks,” as relates to the erection of suitable buildings, for the purpose of holding vestry and other meetings for the transaction of any business of or relating to the parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth, shall be applied to and put in force within the said parish.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the said Resolution :

Now therefore, We, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct that so much of the aforesaid Act as relates to the providing of a room for the purpose of holding any vestry and other meetings for the transaction of the business of or relating to the said parish, shall be applied to, and be put in force in, the said parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth.

And we do hereby further direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

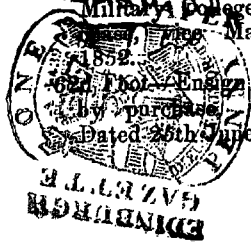
