Dispatches have been this day received from the Right Hon. Sir Morton Eden, K.B. dated Vienna, May 30. with the intelligence, that the Castle of Milan had surrendered by capitulation on the 24th ult. ; that the Imperial troops had also occupied the town of Ferrara, Casale, and Ceva ; which latter place was seized by the peasants of the country, and at their desire garrisoned by the Austrians.
