IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council, that the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain do issue writs for further proroguing the Parliament from Thursday the twenty-first day of October instant, to Thursday the fourth day of November next.

BY THE QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty-first day of October instant, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare that the said Parliament shally be further prorogued, on the said twenty-first day of October instant, to Thursday the fourth day of November next, and We have given notice to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Writ Patent for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the fourth day of November next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the fourth day of November next.

Given at Our Court, at Windsor, this sixteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and in the sixteenth year of Our reign.
