of forging and counterfeiting bank notes.

An Act to amend an Act for guaranteeing the interest on such loans, not exceeding five hundred thousand pounds, as may be raised by the British Colonies on the Continent of South America, in the West Indies, and the Mauritius, for certain purposes.

An Act to authorize the inclosure of certain lands, in pursuance of a special report of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.


