MALTON AND DRIFFIELD JUNCTION
RAILWAY.

(Power to Amalgamate with or Lease the Railway to the York, Newcastle, and Berwick, York and North Midland and Leeds Northern Railway Amalgamated Companies, and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made to Parliament in the present Session, for an Act to authorize (in the event of an union and amalgamation with the York, Newcastle, and Berwick Railway Company, of the York and North Midland Railway Company, and the Leeds Northern Railway Company, taking effect,) the union and amalgamation of the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company with such amalgamated Company, and the union and consolidation into one undertaking of the undertaking of the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company, and of the undertaking of such amalgamated Company, so that all the undertakings, property, estate, and effects, rights, powers, and privileges of what nature and kind soever, and whether, with reference to the levying of tolls, rates, and duties, or otherwise vested in, and belonging to, or exercised and enjoyed by the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company, may be vested in, and belong to, and be exercised and enjoyed by one united and consolidated Company. And also for the dissolution of the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company, and for the incorporation of the shareholders therein with the said amalgamated Company upon such terms and conditions, and with such rights and privileges, and subject to such provisions as shall be mutually agreed upon, and for the fulfilment by, or for such united and consolidated Company, of all or some of the contracts, agreements, and arrangements entered into by the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company. And also for providing for the mortgage and bond and other debts of the Malton and Driffeld Junction Railway Company, and for the security of the holders of such mortgages and bonds and of the other Creditors of the same Company.
