INTIMATION is Hereby Given, in terms of an Interlocutor by the Lords of Council and Session, Commissioners for the Plantation of Kirks and Valuation of Teinds, dated the 26th day of January 1853, and pursuant to the Statute 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44, that a Petition has been presented to their Lordships for and in name of Sir John Stuart Forbes, of Pitsligo and Fettercairn, Bart., and others, all Contributors to the Endowment of the proposed New Church and PARISH of New Pitsligo, situated within the Presbytery of Deer, praying their Lordships, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Acts of Parliament therein recited, to DECERN and ERRECT the said Church of New Pitsligo into a Parish Church in connection with the Church of Scotland, and to MARK OUT and DESIGNATE the District specially set forth in the said Petition, consisting of portions of the Parishes of Tyrie, New Deer, Strichen, and Aberdour, within said Presbytery, or such other District as their Lordships shall see fit, as the District to be attached to the said Church of New Pitsligo, *quoad sacra*; and to DISJOIN such District *quoad sacra* from the said Parishes of Tyrie, New Deer, Strichen, and Aberdour, to which the same now belongs; and to Erect such District into a parish *quoad sacra*, in connection with the Church of Scotland, to be called the Church and PARISH of New Pitsligo; and to Find and Declare that the Minister and Elders of the said Church and Parish so to be erected shall have and enjoy the status, and all the powers, rights, and privileges of a Parish Minister and Elders of the Church of Scotland; and to Find and Declare, that upon the said Church of New Pitsligo, and District to be attached thereto, being erected into a Church and Parish *quoad sacra*, in terms of the foregoing cravings, the Patronage thereof shall be thereafter vested in the Petitioner Sir John Stuart Forbes, as pointed out by the Eighth Article of the Constitution recited in the said Petition, granted to the said Church under the authority of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland; but always under reservation of the right of the Presbytery of the bounds to present to the said Church *jure devoluto* according to law, and as provided in the said Act of the 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44; and to Find, Decern, and Declare in the premises in terms of the foregoing cravings, or in such other terms as to their Lordships shall seem meet; as the said Petition in itself more fully bears: And Intimation is hereby further given, agreeably to the appointment in said Interlocutor, that the Petitioners have lodged printed copies of the said Petition with the Session-Clerks of the said Parishes of Tyrie, New Deer, Strichen, and Aberdour, and with the Reverend John Sharp, Minister of the said Church of New Pitsligo, for the use of such parties interested as may apply for the same.
