Copy of a letter from Mr WILLIAM LE LACHEUR, Commander of the cutter private ship of war the Resolution, to Evan Nepran, Esq. dated at Guernsey, the 20th ult.

I deem it my duty to acquaint you, for the informa-tion of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 25th May, in lat. 43. N. long. 16. W. I fell in with and captured the French schooner privateer La Vigie, of 14 long four pounders, and 71 men, be-longing to Bourdeaux, last from Corunna, from which place she had been out eight days and had taken nothing; the vessel is quite new, coppered, and was completely fitted out for a three months cruize.
