Extract of a letter from Captain Griffiths, Commander of his Majefty's flip Diamond, to Evan Nepean, Eff. dated at Spithead, the 12th instant.

On the 29th ult: the Revolutionaire captured L'Hip polite French letter of marque, from Cayenne, bound to Nantes, and in lat. 46 deg. N. and long. 24 deg. W. we recaptured the brig Margaret, from Greenock bound to Savannah, who had been taken but a few hours be-fore by the Determine French ship privateer then infight; and which, after a chace of fourteen hours, was captured by the Revolutionaire. I have brought here to Spithead: She is a very complete veffel, fails uncommonly fast, and is well calculated for his Majesty's fervice. She is pierced for twenty-four guns, mounts eighteen brass twelve and nine pounders, and had one hundred and fixty-three men on board when taken.
