ADMIRALTY-OFFICE, July 16.

Extract of a letter from Captain GRIFFITHS, Commander of his Majesty's ship Diamond, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated at Spithead, the 12th instant.

On the 29th ult. the Revolutionaire captured L'Hippolite French letter of marque, from Cayenne, bound to Nantes, and in lat. 46 deg. N. and long. 24 deg. W. we recaptured the brig Margaret, from Greenock bound to Savannah, who had been taken but a few hours before by the Determiné French ship privateer then in sight : and which, after a chase of fourteen hours, was captured by the Revolutionaire. I have brought her to Spithead : She is a very complete vessel, sails uncommonly fast, and is well calculated for his Majesty's service. She is pierced for twenty-four guns, mounts eighteen brass twelve and nine pounders, and had one hundred and sixty-three men on board when taken.
