LAW,

27th May 1853.

GRANTING freedom to certain ports and territories in the Province of Chocó, and establishing Custom-Houses.

The Senate and Chamber of Representatives of New Granada, in Session

DECREE :

ART. I. The following ports and territories of the Province of Chocó shall be free for all Nations in the World, from the 1st of January 1854, for 20 years.

1. The ports of the Atlantic, and the territory watered by the River Atrato, from its mouth to its confluence with the River Guito, comprehended between the western chain of the Andes and that branch of it towards the eastward, which separates said Province from that of Antiochia.

2. The ports of the Pacific, and the territory watered by the River San Juan, from its embouchure as far as the city of Novita, contained between the above-mentioned chain of the Andes and that branch of it which separates it towards the southward from the Province of Buenaventura.

ART. II. Consequently no Custom-houses can be established in said ports and territories within the time specified, nor can any duties be levied, save those of toll passages and excise, corresponding to the municipal revenues, and in conformity with existing laws.

ART. III. In order to recover the duties on importation of Foreign merchandize which may be introduced for the consumption of the interior of the rest of the Province, and other Provinces of the Republic, there shall be established two Custom-houses, one in the city of Quibdo, and the other in the city of Novita, with the following officers, and their yearly salaries.

[Here follows an enumeration of the different officers and their respective salaries.]

ART. IV. The Executive Power is authorized, when it deems it indispensable for weighty motives of public convenience, to assign other ports for Custom-houses than those expressed in this law, in which case the maritime ports expressed in Article I. and the territory comprised between the coasts and the spot on which such Custom-houses shall be fixed, alone can enjoy freedom.

### J HAMILTON WATER WORKS.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session, for an Act for the better Supplying with Water the Parliamentary Burgh or Town of Hamilton and Suburbs thereof, and places adjacent, in the County of Lanark: And for that purpose, with powers to take and acquire, by compulsory purchase or otherwise, lands and other heritages, and certain rivers, brooks, streams, and springs of water, and also to construct, lay down, and maintain, such reservoirs, cuts, aqueducts, and other works, with proper roads of approach, and other conveniences in connection therewith, as may be proper and necessary; and in particular, to construct and maintain the following works, that is to say, a Reservoir or Reservoirs, with Embankments, and all proper Works connected therewith, on the burn, brook, or stream called EARNOCK BURN, partly on the lands called Wellbrae, and partly on the lands called High Muirhouses, or on one or other of them, all in the Parish of Hamilton; commencing at or near the farm steading of the said lands of Wellbrae, at a point marked A on the Plan hereinafter mentioned, and terminating at a point marked B on the said Plan; also, a Filtering Basin and a Distributing Basin on the said lands of Wellbrae and Laigh, and High Muirhouses, in connection with, and at or near to the said reservoir or reservoirs; also a Cut or Conduit, commencing at or near to a place called Kennedy's House, and terminating at or in the said reservoir or reservoirs; and also, a main pipe or track, commencing at or in the said filtering and distributing basins, and terminating in the said Town of Hamilton, at or near the south-west end of Almada Street; and also with powers to take and acquire the said burn, brook, or stream called the EARNOCK BURN, and also a burn, brook, or stream called Kennedy's Burn, both in the said Parish of Hamilton, with the sources and affluents thereof, in the said lands of Wellbrae and Laigh and High Muirhouses, and also in the lands of Kennedy's, or some of them; and to make and construct dams, embankments, catch-water drains, and other works, for the purpose of diverting and storing the water flowing into the said burns, brooks, or streams of water, and from the sources and affluents thereof, into the said reservoir or reservoirs, filtering and distributing basins, conduits, and pipe or main track for the purpose of being conveyed to, and distributed in, the said Burgh or Town of Hamilton, and Suburbs, and places adjacent; and it is further intended by the said Bill to take power to open up the lands, roads, and thoroughfares in the course of the said main or pipe track, and also the streets, squares, lanes, roads, public ways, and closes, and places within the said Burgh and Suburbs, and places adjacent, and to lay down therein all such further pipes as may be necessary for distributing the water throughout the same; all which intended works will be made and maintained, or will be situated in, and all such burns, brooks, or streams are situated, within the said Parish of Hamilton; and which said Burgh or Town of Hamilton, and Suburbs, and places adjacent, are situated in the said Parish of Hamilton, all in the said County of Lanark; and it is further intended by the said Act to take power to open up, cross, divert, or alter, whether temporarily or permanently, all such Turnpike, Parish, or other roads and streets, and such brooks, burns, or streams, within the Parish and places aforesaid, as may be necessary in the execution of the said

several intended works; and also to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected with the said lands or houses, or the said burns, brooks, or streams, or which would in any manner interfere with the construction, maintenance, and use of the said intended works, and to confer other rights and privileges; and it is also intended by the said Act to make provision for the nomination or election of Commissioners for the purpose of constructing the said works, and carrying out the purposes of the said Act; and it is further intended by the said Act to take powers to levy rates, rents, duties, or assessments, for and in respect of the water to be supplied as aforesaid, and also to levy by public rate or assessment on all house and other property within the said burgh, suburbs and places adjacent, and the owners and occupiers thereof such additional rates and duties as may be necessary, with the said rents, rates, and duties for water supplied, for raising, securing, or paying off the money or the interest thereof, which it may be necessary to borrow or raise for the purposes of the said Act, on the security of the said works, and of the said rents, rates, duties, and assessment, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of such rents, rates, or duties and assessment, and to confer other rights and privileges in relation thereto. And it is further intended by the said Act to authorise and empower the said Commissioners to borrow and take up at interest, such sum of money as may be necessary for the purposes of the said Act, and the construction and completion of the said works, and to grant securities over the same, and the rents, assessments, and revenues arising therefrom, for the repayment of the amount so borrowed, and the interest thereof; and also to provide that as soon as the money so borrowed and other claims affecting the said proposed works shall be paid off and discharged, the said Commissioners, upon the requisition of the Magistrates and Town Council of the Burgh of Hamilton, shall transfer and make over to the said Magistrates and Town Council, for behoof of the community of the said burgh, the whole of the said Water Works, and rights, privileges, and powers thereto belonging and to be conferred on them by the said Act, and to enable the said Magistrates and Town Council to accept of the same, and to exercise and enjoy all such rights, powers, and privileges, and to levy such limited rents, rates, duties, and assessments, as may be necessary for the upholding and maintenance of the said works; and also to enable the said Magistrates and Council to advance such sum of money out of the said Burgh funds as they may think expedient towards the said undertaking.

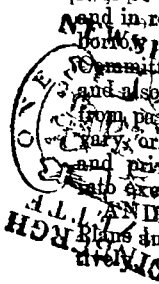
