This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that the Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight millions out of the consolidated fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

An Act for raising the sum of six millions by Exchequer Bonds and Exchequer Bills.

An Act for granting to Her Majesty an increased rate of duty on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices.

An Act to amend the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1852.

An Act to enable the Collector-General of Dublin to levy money to repay a certain outlay by the Corporation for preserving and improving the Port of Dublin in and about, repairing the Quay Wall of the River Liffey, and for future repairs thereof, and for repairing and rebuilding bridges over the said river.

An Act to enable the New River Company to construct new reservoirs and other works, in the county of Middlesex.

An Act for better supplying with water the town of Padilham, and the neighbourhood thereof, and the villages of Habbergham or Cheapside, and Lower Houses or Thornhill Holme, all in the parish of Whalley, in the county of Lancaster.

An Act for the improvement of the town of Burnley, and parts of the neighbourhood thereof, and for other purposes, and of which the short title is "The Burnley Improvement Act, 1854."
